Dear Parents,

Applications for the John Paul II Character in Leadership Scholarship are now available. These scholarships are traditionally funded by donations from current and past school board members. This year, three \$1000 scholarships will be awarded, one each to a current 5th, 6th, and 7th grader to be used toward next year's tuition. Students who have applied in the past may reapply.

To qualify, a student must:

- be in 5th, 6th or 7th grade and have attended School of the Incarnation for at least 3 years
- be in good academic and disciplinary standing
- not be related to a member of the School Board
- submit a completed application and all required materials **on or before April 27, 2017**

The scholarships will be awarded to students who exhibit outstanding character, show concern for others, and contribute to the school's community through their leadership in academics, extra-curricular activities, and service. The application process includes an original student essay, list of service activities, and two letters of recommendation, all of which are described in detail in the application packet. We encourage students to provide teachers and other recommenders with at least one week's notice when they request letters of recommendation.

Each application will be assigned a number and names will be removed before review to ensure objectivity. Board-appointed representatives will review all applications, and the School Board and Principal will award the scholarships at morning prayer in June.

ESSAY QUESTION

Pope John Paul II had a special connection with young people. Even as a young parish priest, the future pope devoted much of his time and energy to young people--playing soccer, teaching religion, and leading philosophical discussions. Throughout his papacy, John Paul II continued to reach out to young people. By establishing World Youth Day, and personally participating in it, the Pope demonstrated the affection and care he had for young people.

At World Youth Day in 2002, Pope John Paul II told the young people gathered, “To believe in Jesus is to accept what he says, even when it runs contrary to what others are saying.” Write about something you have experienced that seems to run contrary to Jesus’ teachings. Were you able to accept what Jesus said, in spite of what others might be saying or doing? How were you able to respond to that conflict? How can you be the voice of Jesus in such situations and do you expect that to be difficult?

Write an essay of between 400 and 600 words to answer this question.

CHECK YOUR ESSAY TO MAKE SURE YOU HAVE:

- Focused on the topic and organized your thoughts.
- Made your essay personal. (We should learn something about you by reading it)
- Included relevant information and elaborated to enhance ideas.
- Used variety in your vocabulary and sentence structure.
- Paid attention to spelling, punctuation, and grammar.
