SOTI Asynchronous Remote Learning Days

Per the updated AOB policy regarding inclement weather, after the first three inclement weather days of the year, the school will pivot to asynchronous learning for the next two inclement weather days. On those days, students will be expected to complete lessons provided by teachers via Google classroom and SOTI Studies.

- Daily assignments will be posted on SOTI Studies for all grade levels by 8:00 AM on asynchronous learning days.
- Attendance will be based on completion of assignments
- Assignments should be completed independently at home with minimal support needed.
 - PreK will have optional activities to be completed at home
 - K-5 will have one assignment for both math and ELA with an additional assignment from religion, science, social studies, or cross-curricular. Each assignment should take approximately 20-30 minutes to complete.
 - Grades 6-8 will have one assignment for each core subject: math, ELA, religion, science, and social studies. Each assignment should be approximately 20-30 minutes to complete.
- Student work must be submitted to the teacher by the time they come to school the following day. Classwork and/or assessments that are due may be locked and marked as incomplete if not done in the expected window of time.
- Specials (art, PE, music, world cultures, Spanish) will not post assignments for weather-related school closures.
- Parents and students should communicate questions directly to the teachers.

Re-enrollment for current students for the 24-25 school year

The re-enrollment process for current students at School of the Incarnation for the 2024-2025 school year has begun. It is important for us to know which students are returning before we begin to offer spots to new applicants. The "Intent to Re-Enroll" Form and re-registration fee must be submitted electronically through your SchoolAdmin parent portal account if you plan for your child/children to return to School of the Incarnation next year.

*The re-enrollment fee is now \$200 per student if paid by February 15th. See below for the complete fee schedule and deadlines.

<u>Re-enrollment fee schedule:</u>

\$100 if paid by January 15th
\$150 if paid between January 16th and January 31st
\$200 if paid between February 1st and February 15th
If not paid by February 15th, your child's spot will be released.







New Family Referral Program



Our current Incarnation families are by far the best ambassadors for spreading the word about our school! Our New Family Referral Program rewards current families with a one-time \$250 tuition credit for referring a new family who applies and enrolls. Here's how it works:

- If you know of a family that you believe may be interested in School of the Incarnation, complete the "New Family Referral Form" below and submit to the school office.
- Reach out to the family and share your experiences at School of the Incarnation. Share with them the reasons you have chosen Catholic education and why you think they should do the same. Let them know that you have or will refer their information to the school and that an admissions representative will call or email them to provide more information.
- For each new family that applies and enrolls at least one full-time student, a \$250 tuition credit will be awarded to the current referring family <u>after the new student has been in attendance for 30 days.</u>
- Siblings of current students and previously enrolled students do not qualify as new families. Staff members are not eligible for the referral credit.
- Note that this form must be on file in the front office before the new family has contacted the school on their own for information or to visit so it is best to submit the form as soon as possible after speaking with the new family. In other words, the referral form is not retroactive and you are not eligible for the referral if the family contacts school before the referral.
- This referral program is open to all families with students currently enrolled in PreK4-Grade 8.
- Referral fees are limited to one per family per academic year.
