BEYOND

DESTINATION IMAGINATION

Rising Stars (PreK - 2nd)

In a play-based environment, students are encouraged to share ideas, be creative, design, build, and make all items related to their team's performance, become comfortable working with others on a given topic (this year's focus is on Rockets and Space Travel), and learn how to speak in front of an audience.

Challenge Program Team (Middle School)

Each year, the team chooses from one of six project-based Challenges - Technical, Scientific, Engineering, Fine Arts, Improvisational, and Service Learning. Students collaborate, use critical thinking and problem solving skills, as well as integrate science, technology, engineering, arts, and math.

CATHOLIC ROBOTICS LEAGUE/FIRST LEGO LEAGUE

First Lego League Jr. (K - 3rd)

Uses STEM concepts while exciting students through a brand they know and love - LEGO®. Students build models using LEGO® Education WeDo 2.0 and create Show Me posters to present what they learned. The program focuses on building interest in science, technology, engineering, and math (STEM) through a real-world challenge - to be solved by research, critical thinking, and imagination.

First Lego League (4th - 8th)

The program is built around theme-based Challenges to engage students in researching, problem solving, coding, and engineering. The foundation of the program is the FIRST® Core Values, which emphasize teamwork, discovery, and innovation.

KNIGHTLY READERS BOOK CLUB

Students read an assigned book, then meet as a group (bi-weekly) to discuss and complete projects related to the book's theme.

KNIGHTS ON A MISSION

Outreach and service oriented club driven by student ideas. Help at local food pantries, Visit local assisted living/nursing homes, support the 5 parishes ministries. Additional ideas and interests of students

ENVIRONMENTAL CLUB

Caring for Creation (3rd-8th)

- Learn about, participate in, and help monitor the school's various recycling initiatives (paper, crayons, markers, yellow recycling cans during lunch times)
- Presentations/programs and guest speakers from area organizations that show care for God's creation Additional ideas and interests of students

Extras for Grades 5-8

- Learn about the Terrapins in the Classroom program (help care for the school's terrapin during years that our school is assigned one) and other MD initiatives that show care for God's creation
- A field trip to Poplar Island (or similar location) may be available in the spring for students who participated during Trimesters 1 and 2

CODING CLUB

Each session will explore various devices and coding languages. Students will complete a project utilizing their newly learned coding skills.

CHESS CLUB (2nd-8th)

Students will learn the basics of how to play the game of chess. Each trimester will conclude with a tournament.

GIRLS ON THE RUN

(2nd - 5th only)

This club inspire girls to be joyful, healthy and confident using a fun, experience-based curriculum which creatively integrates running.

6 weeks on Fridays from 3-4:30pm

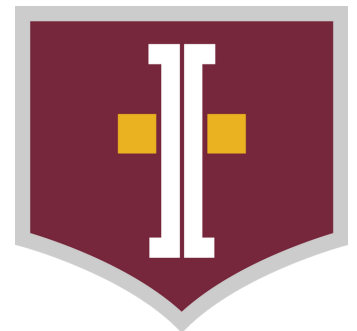
DANCE AND CHEER CLUB

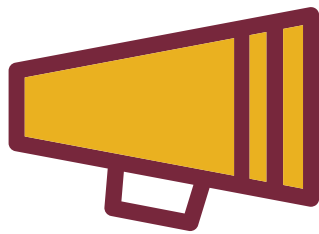
