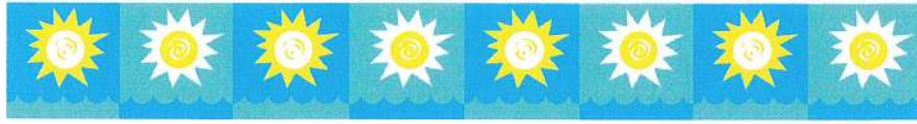


# Incoming First Grade Required Summer Work
