Dear Parents.

Drum roll please ...It's Homecoming Time!!! Tomorrow we are looking forward to great weather, great games and activities, lots of fun and an overall super day to celebrate and show Knights pride! Tomorrow is a **spirit wear day** - please see below for the complete spirit wear dress code. However...for Homecoming we have **a few special additions**:

Face Paint allowed according to the following guidelines:

- Acceptable colors: Maroon, yellow, gold, or white
- Appropriate and sparing (i.e entire face may not be covered, no handprints)
- Face painting on the face only (not other parts of the body such as arms and legs)
- Students wearing face paint that is deemed by the administration as inappropriate, distracting, or not in the spirit of the guidelines will be asked to remove the face paint

Hair color allowed according to the following guidelines:

- Acceptable colors: Maroon, yellow, gold, white, grey
- Color must be temporary and washed out (or mostly out) by Monday.
- Decorative bows, jewels in hair, <u>braiding with colored string</u> (maroon, white, gold)

Tomorrow!!! Spirit Wear Day - Friday, October 4th

Our next Spirit Wear Day is Friday, October 4th. Spirit wear days are distinct from out of uniform days and Tag days. Spirit wear days are special days designated by the principal when the students, faculty, and staff may come to school dressed in official School of the Incarnation spirit wear. These days usually fall on Friday or may be on a spirit night or any day designated by the principal. All spirit wear days will be listed on the calendar. Spirit wear days are optional, and if a student does not choose to dress in spirit wear on these days, he/she should come to school in the regular school uniform. The following are guidelines for spirit wear days:

• Students should wear an official School of the Incarnation spirit wear shirt* which is one of the following acceptable school colors: maroon, gold/yellow, grey, white, or black.

- Any other School of the Incarnation spirit wear can be worn on these days with the exception of hats which may
 not be worn inside the building.
- Spirit wear that is defaced, torn, altered or written on is not permissible.
- Dresses and skirts must be of reasonable length (no more than 3 inches above the knee) and not too tight. No thin straps or bare shoulders.
- Pants Presentable jeans or pants are acceptable, but not pants that are tight. Leggings or spandex are not allowed.
- Shorts may be worn from August-November 4th and April-1st-June. Hair may not be dyed or combed in an unusual fashion.
- When the weather turns cold, spirit wear must be visible. For example: it would be unacceptable to be wearing a SOTI t-shirt which was completely covered by a Spalding sweatshirt.
- No hats are to be worn in school unless specified within the themes.
- Any shoes may be worn, except open-toed sandals, flip flops, clogs, thick-soled or high-heeled shoes.
- Earrings: Boys are not allowed to wear earrings at any time. Earrings for girls should be small posts or hoops.

*Examples include: Always t-shirt, past school issued t-shirts of an approved color such as club shirts, SOTI PE t-shirt, or current SOTI athletic jerseys during the appropriate season.

This year, you can set up an eWallet account for your child to shop the Book Fair. It's the safe, secure, EASY way to fund your child's Book Fair purchases. With eWallet, there's no need to send in cash or a check with your child. You set the amount that is in the account, and you will be credited for any unspent money at the end of the Book Fair. To set up an eWallet account, go to the SOTI Book Fair homepage: https://bookfairs.scholastic.com/bf/schoolofincarnation1. Click on "Get Started" in the eWallet section, then click "Go to eWallet." On the sign-in page, click on "Register" to create a Scholastic account, or click on "Sign In" if you already have a Scholastic account. From there, you'll be prompted to create your eWallet account. You can print a card for your child to bring in to the Book Fair, and the Book Fair cashiers can also look up your child's name and account right from the registers.

Does your child love to sing?

Dear Parents or Guardians:

The start of the cold and flu season will soon be upon us. To prevent widespread illness in school, we recommend that your child stay home from school if experiencing flu or cold symptoms. To decide whether or not to send your child to school, please consider the following guidelines:

Consider keeping your child at home for an extra day of rest and observation if he/she has any of the following symptoms:

- Very stuffy or runny nose and/or cough
- Mild sore throat (no fever, no known exposure to strep)
- Headache
- Mild stomach ache

Definitely keep your child home for treatment and observation if he/she has any of these symptoms:

- Fever greater than 100 degrees by mouth. Your child may return to school only after his/her temperature has been consistently below 100 degrees, by mouth, for a minimum of 24 hours without medication intervention.
- Vomiting, even once
- Chills
- General malaise or feelings of fatigue, weakness or muscle aches
- Frequent congested (wet) or croupy cough
- Lots of nasal congestion with frequent blowing of nose

To help prevent the spread of flu and colds, teach your children good hygiene habits:

- Wash hands frequently and well.
- Turn off the water faucet with a paper towel instead of using your freshly cleaned hands.
- Keep hands away from your eyes, nose and mouth.
- Cover mouth and nose when sneezing or coughing use a tissue, throw it away directly and then wash hands or cough into your inner elbow.
- Avoid close contact with people who are sick.

A child who has started antibiotics needs to be on medication for 24 hours before considered non-contagious and able to return to school. Often when a child awakens with vague complaints (the way colds and the flu begin) it is wise to observe your child at home for an hour or two before deciding whether or not to bring them to school. Sending children to school to "see how they do" or instructing them to go to the school nurse and call you if they can't make it or feel worse is not advisable. Your child should be physically able to participate in all school activities on return to school. Keeping a sick child at home will minimize the spread of infections and viruses to other students, faculty and staff. Lastly, please consider getting your child the flu vaccine each year.

Thank you in advance for helping make this year at school as healthy as possible!

HOMECOMING DISMISSAL DIRECTIONS

- 1. No students may attend Homecoming festivities without custodial transfer to a legal guardian (This includes **walkers/riders and ESP students**, who may not attend unless an adult is on the premises who is responsible for them.
- 2. All families who dismiss from the parking lot must make a decision about whether they are staying in our Parking Lot until Homecoming begins at 3:30 or if they are leaving at dismissal (and hopefully coming back later).
 - a. **Families choosing to stay for Homecoming** (including HOV families) should park at the bottom of their respective lot in a parking space (see image). At dismissal, parents and students will wait near or in their vehicles until 3:30 when Homecoming opens.
 - b. **Families choosing to leave at dismissal** should park as far up in their respective lot as they can (see image; we will dismiss from the top on Friday) and dismiss normally otherwise. HOV families leaving at dismissal will follow normal protocol.
- 3. **ESP families** will receive an email about adjustments to pick-up policies for Friday only.

New Family Referral Program

Our current Incarnation families are by far the best ambassadors for spreading the word about our school! Our New Family Referral Program rewards current families with a one-time \$250 tuition credit for referring a new family who applies and enrolls. Here's how it works:

- If you know of a family that you believe may be interested in School of the Incarnation, complete the "New Family Referral Form" below and submit to the school office.
- Reach out to the family and share your experiences at School of the Incarnation. Share with them the reasons you have chosen Catholic education and why you think they should do the same. Let them know that you have or will refer their information to the school and that an admissions representative will call or email them to provide more information.
- For each new family that applies and enrolls at least one full-time student, a \$250 tuition credit will be awarded to the current referring family after the new student has been in attendance for 30 days.
- Siblings of current students and previously enrolled students do not qualify as new families. Staff members are not eligible for the referral credit.
- Note that this form must be on file in the front office before the new family has contacted the school on their
 own for information or to visit so it is best to submit the form as soon as possible after speaking with the new
 family. In other words, the referral form is not retroactive and you are not eligible for the referral if the family
 contacts school before the referral.
- This referral program is open to all families with students currently enrolled in PreK4-Grade 8.
- Referral fees are limited to one per family per academic year.
