#### Message from our Athletic Director

For safety purposes, the only time students should stay after school for athletics is for their team's 4:00 PM home games and 3:00 PM practices. If your child's team does not have a study hall prior to later games or practices, they need to follow their normal dismissal procedure and return to school at the time communicated by coaches. Students interested in attending games to watch should follow their normal dismissal procedure as well. Children must be accompanied by an adult to attend games. We understand this may provide a challenge with your schedules but having students hanging around after school unsupervised is not an option.

#### SOTI Inclement Weather Policy

As we enter into the time of the school year with the highest probability of inclement weather, the inclement weather policy from the *Parent Student Handbook* is included below in its entirety. However, as a general rule, SOTI follows AACPS for decisions of weather-related school closures. The only exception would be in the case that AACPS is not in session on a day when there is inclement weather or if there is something significant related to SOTI's campus that warrants an independent decision. SOTI has three inclement weather days built into its calendar. The fourth day and any subsequent days would be remote learning days.

SwiftReach is the system that SOTI uses to communicate with our families whether it be the weekly newsletter, event reminders, or emergencies. Depending on the communication, we choose whether we want the communication to go out via email, text, and/or phone call. Regular communications typically only go out via email. However, when there is a school closure, SOTI uses SwiftReach to communicate that closure to families via email, text, AND phone call.

## Dear 3rd, 4th, & 5th Grade Families,

Students will begin playing Recorders in January! Recorders are an essential part of the music curriculum because it teaches students music literacy, rhythm, and fine motor skills on an instrument. I do work on proper playing technique to avoid the squeaks and squawks. Dear School of the Incarnation Families,

School of the Incarnation is committed to proper safety measures, transparent communication, and adapting to changing COVID conditions. Our primary focus is on keeping the well-being of our students, faculty, and staff as our top priority.

In accord with the most recent guidance, we will report positive COVID- 19 cases on a weekly basis. School-wide notifications of such cases will be sent out on Thursdays via the School Newsletter. We will not be contact tracing and identifying close contacts within school.

The following positive Covid cases have been reported in our school community:

- Second grade student in Mrs. Shallow's homeroom. Last day in school was 12/2/22.
- Fourth grade student in Mrs. Ricarid's homeroom. Last day in school was 12/2/22.
- Kindergarten student in Mr. Rehanek's classroom. Last day in school was 12/8/22.
- Seventh grade student in Ms. Colclough's homeroom. Last day in school was 12/12/22.
- Preschool siblings in Mrs. Smith's classroom. Last day in school was 12/8/22.

We encourage you to continue to actively monitor the health of your child daily and be alert to any of the major symptoms of COVID; including, but not limited to, fever, cough, sore throat, and shortness of breath. Masking is optional unless directed to do so by a health official after a quarantine. The school is not responsible for enforcing any individual masking preferences or obligations. Should any concerning symptoms appear, please contact your medical professional and alert the school office at 410-519-2285.

Should you wish to review additional information to address any questions regarding your child's potential exposure to a COVID-positive individual, we encourage you to visit the CDC, Maryland Department of Health, or local health department's websites. ## New Family Referral Program



Our current Incarnation families are by far the best ambassadors for spreading the word about our school! Our New Family Referral Program rewards current families with a one-time \$250 tuition credit for referring a new family who applies and enrolls. Here's how it works:

- If you know of a family that you believe may be interested in School of the Incarnation, complete the "New Family Referral Form" below and submit to the school office.
- Reach out to the family and share your experiences at School of the Incarnation. Share with them the reasons you have chosen Catholic education and why you think they should do the same. Let them know that you have or will refer their information to the school and that an admissions representative will call or email them to provide more information.
- For each new family that applies and enrolls at least one full-time student, a \$250 tuition credit will be awarded to the current referring family <u>after the new student has been in attendance for 30 days.</u>
- Siblings of current students and previously enrolled students do not qualify as new families. Staff members are not eligible for the referral credit.
- Note that this form must be on file in the front office before the new family has contacted the school on their own for information or to visit so it is best to submit the form as soon as possible after speaking with the new family. In other words, the referral form is not retroactive and you are not eligible for the referral if the family contacts school before the referral.
- This referral program is open to all families with students currently enrolled in PreK4-Grade 8.
- Referral fees are limited to one per family per academic year.
