Pre HSPT Scores and HSPT Prep Course Registration, ACTION NEEDED ASAP:

Score reports for students who took the Pre HSPT will be emailed with the end of year Progress Reports, and a fact sheet with FAQ can be accessed <u>here</u>.

Additionally, the Archdiocese of Baltimore has opened registration for a nine-week HSPT Prep Class for rising 8th graders, which will be held in the fall. **This class will absolutely reach capacity and spots will only be guaranteed for families who register by June 24th.** Last year, students who participated in the program scored 12 points higher than those students who were not in the program, so it is definitely an important opportunity to consider. Summer Work and School Supply Lists

Teachers are currently working on preparing summer work (K-8) and supply lists for the 22-23 school year. The purpose of summer work is to help students retain the learning and growth that they have made throughout the year so that they are ready to hit the ground running when they return. To that end, it is better to spend time working on these assignments incrementally over the course of the summer rather than waiting until right before school returns to complete them. **Summer work will be posted on SOTI Studies after June 9**, and you should look at the grade level that your child will be entering in the 22-23 school year. For example, a current kindergarten student will complete the summer work for the rising 1st graders. At the end of the summer, the summer work is turned in to their new teachers. All summer work is entered as a graded assignment in T1.

Program Details

- Designed to equip students with knowledge, skills, and strategies to maximize performance on the HSPT
- Courses are taught online with a capacity of 20 students per class.
- Week 1 includes a course overview, a HSPT overview, and strategies applicable across all test sections
- Weeks 2-9 are split into two, four-week sections. One section, taught by an English teacher, focuses on the Reading, Language, and Verbal sections. The other section, taught by a Math teacher, focuses on the Mathematics and Quantitative sections.
- Offered Monday through Thursday evenings from 7-8 PM and Saturday mornings from 9-10 AM
- Students attend one session per week and families register for the day and time that fits their schedule.
- Students will be required to purchase the Barron's HSPT book and expected to complete weekly homework assignments between classes.

Program Cost: \$100 per student **Priority Registration:** June 6th - 24th Registration will remain open after June 24 until capacity is met.

Pre-High School Placement Test (Pre-HSPT) Frequently Asked Questions

What are the HSPT and Pre-HSPT?

The HSPT (High School Placement Test) is the test that is required for entrance into all 18 Catholic high schools within the Archdiocese of Baltimore. The HSPT is taken by students during the winter of their 8th grade year.

The Pre-HSPT is a practice exam that gives current 7th graders an opportunity to prepare for the HSPT by familiarizing themselves with the test content, structure and timing, as well as offering insight on their performance.

Why did 7th grade students take the Pre-HSPT?

The benefits of taking the Pre-HSPT include:

- Students become familiar with the structure of the five sections of the test.
- Students become familiar with the types of questions that are asked. Students can begin to see patterns in the types of multiple-choice answers offered and the typical language used.
- Students become familiar with the timing of the five sections on the test, thereby helping the students to plan an efficient approach to taking the test during their 8th grade year.
- Students will receive their scores prior to the summer so that they can use the summer and fall
 months for guided practice in order to improve scores, get admitted to their high school of
 choice, and perhaps qualify for scholarship awards.

What do the scores mean?

Students receive a one-page report that outlines their performance on each of the five sections of the assessment; (1) verbal skills, (2) quantitative skills, (3) reading, (4) mathematics, and (5) language. In addition, students receive total cognitive skills (a combination of the verbal and quantitative sections), total basic skills (a combination of reading, math, and language) and composite (a combination of all five sections) scores. This report provides a graphic representation of students' "National Percentile Rank" (NPR) that illustrates how students compare to a national sample of test takers. In addition, the report provides a detailed explanation for "What the Test Measures" and "What the Score for Each Test Means."

Are students being compared to 7th or 8th grade students?

Students' NPR on the Pre-HSPT is based on the performance of other 7th graders. When students take the HSPT, student scores are compared to other 8th graders to determine their NPR.

Will high schools receive Pre-HSPT scores?

No, high schools do not receive Pre-HSPT results.

What can students do over the summer and fall to improve performance on their HSPT?

If a student scored below average or lower than you might have expected on the Pre-HSPT, don't worry this is only a practice test. The purpose of administering the Pre-HSPT is to give students the best opportunity to see the skill areas measured, experience the timed nature of the test, and generally become more comfortable with the test before the HSPT test is administered in the winter. The provided score report shows any areas of deficiency which can help your student brush up on skills over the summer.

The Archdiocese of Baltimore also offers *HSPT Prep*, which is an online, synchronous nine week course designed to prepare students to take the HSPT by equipping them with the knowledge, skills, and strategies needed to maximize performance. New Family Referral Program

Our current Incarnation families are by far the best ambassadors for spreading the word about our school! Our New Family Referral Program rewards current families with a one-time \$250 tuition credit for referring a new family who applies and enrolls. Here's how it works:

- If you know of a family that you believe may be interested in School of the Incarnation, complete the "New Family Referral Form" below and submit to the school office.
- Reach out to the family and share your experiences at School of the Incarnation. Share with them the reasons you have chosen Catholic education and why you think they should do the same. Let them know that you have or will refer their information to the school and that an admissions representative will call or email them to provide more information.
- For each new family that applies and enrolls at least one full-time student, a \$250 tuition credit will be awarded to the current referring family after the new student has been in attendance for 30 days.
- Siblings of current students and previously enrolled students do not qualify as new families. Staff members are not eligible for the referral credit.
- Note that this form must be on file in the front office before the new family has contacted the school on their
 own for information or to visit so it is best to submit the form as soon as possible after speaking with the new
 family. In other words, the referral form is not retroactive and you are not eligible for the referral if the family
 contacts school before the referral.
- This referral program is open to all families with students currently enrolled in PreK4-Grade 8.
- Referral fees are limited to one per family per academic year.
